Frequently Asked Questions

WHO ATTENDS CONVENTION?

Convention attracts more than 1,100 municipal elected officials and administrators, as well as partners from the province, private sector and community organizations. In addition to registered delegates, the Trade Show features more than 100 booths.

AM I REQUIRED TO WEAR MY NAME TAG?

Yes, your name tag gains you entrance into all Convention programs, including the Trade Show, so please wear it at all times. It also helps to remind you of the names of other members you haven't seen in a while.

AM I REQUIRED TO WEAR MY MASK?

Due to the mask bylaws put in place by the Government of Alberta, individuals attending indoor events are required to wear a mask at all times, unless consuming food or beverage within a designated dining area.

WHAT DOES MY REGISTRATION GET ME?

Your registration gets you access to all committee and board reports, Opening Ceremonies and Keynote address, dialogue sessions with provincial Ministers, education sessions, the AGM, and the Trade Show.

Your registration also includes full hot breakfast and lunch buffets from Wednesday to Friday, with a lunch-to-go on Friday, and coffee throughout Convention breaks.

We will also be recording the audio from the sessions, along with the slides, and posting those for attendees following the close of the event.

WHAT IS THE DRESS CODE?

While there is no dress code for Convention, we recommend business casual attire.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS?

In order to be eligible to vote, you must be an elected official from a regular member of the association (city, town, village, summer village or specialized municipality), registered for Convention and be present during voting.

WHEN DO RESOLUTIONS TAKE PLACE?

Resolutions takes place in Hall A on Thursday, November 18 starting at 2:00 p.m.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE DURING ELECTIONS?

In order to be eligible to vote, you must be an elected official from a regular member of the association (elected officials only), registered for Convention and be present present during voting, either in-person or virtual.

All voting delegates are eligible to vote for the president position. For Director

All voting delegates are eligible to vote for the president position. For Director and Vice President positions, the persons eligible are voting delegates from the respective membership zone. For example, only delegates from the Villages East electoral zone are eligible to vote for the Director of Villages East position.

WHEN DO ELECTIONS TAKE PLACE?

Board elections are taking place on Friday, November 19 during the AGM, starting at approximately 8:15 a.m.

HOW DO I VOTE?

All elected officials from regular members of the association who register for convention will receive an email containing an online voting log in for Simply Voting. That Simply Voting log in will be used for both resolutions and elections.

WHAT ARE THE STICKERS IN MY KIT FOR?

Delegates can use the stickers to indicate their level of comfort around other attendees. Simply pick the sticker that best represents you and put it on your name tag.

RED - Please greet me from a distance.

YELLOW - I'm comfortable with handshakes & high fives.

GREEN - All of the above, and open to hugs.

Delegate Code of Conduct

We are committed to providing a welcoming, inclusive and harassment-free environment for all persons attending the Convention ("Convention Participants"), regardless of gender, race, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, ethnicity, age, religion or any other legally protected characteristic.

The following guidelines apply to all facets of the Convention including sponsor hosted events, workshops, plenaries, political meetings and social gatherings where Convention Participants are in attendance.

Behaviours that are not acceptable at the Convention include:

- Harassment or intimidation based on gender, race, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, ethnicity, age, religion or any other legally protected characteristic.
- Sexual harassment or intimidation, including unwelcome sexual attention, stalking (physical or virtual), or unsolicited physical contact.
- c. Shouting down or threatening Convention Participants.
- Refusing to comply with requirements for proof of vaccination or a negative Covid-19 test.
- Failing to comply with the mask mandate outlined in the public health order.

Any Convention Participant found violating these rules may have their registration revoked and be asked to leave the Convention, without a refund, at the discretion of the CEO or designate.

How to Vote at Convention

Prior to the start of Convention, all registered elected officials from regular member municipalities received voting credential from Simply Voting. These voting credentials are personalized to each elected official, except this year you will be using your own device. Your personal credentials grant access to vote only on the items you are eligible for. For example, when you vote for a Board of Director position, you will only see the vote based on your electoral zone.

The email you receive from Simply Voting will look something like this:

There is a test vote that is open now. Please check your credentials and cast a vote in the test question as soon as possible so that we can be sure you received your credentials.
