



Spending priorities



(very/somewhat acceptable)

(62%) Increasing or introducing new user fees (e.g. recreation facilities)

(57%) Reduce spending on public recreation facilities

(50%) Reduce spending on public transit

(33%) Reduce spending on other municipal services (e.g. road

maintenance, garbage collection, libraries)

(30%) Increasing rider fees on utility services

(26%) Reduce spending on local policing

(24%) Increasing business property taxes

(19%) Increasing residential property taxes


Business processes
